SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1. Description of first aid measures

General information

General first aid, rest, warmth and fresh air. Do not give victim anything to drink if they are unconscious. Get medical attention if any discomfort continues.

Inhalation

Self contained breathing apparatus and full protective clothing must be worn in case of fire.

Provide eyewash station.
